C ommunication

- Recently a resident's daughter, while walking along Payne (near Clifton Center), was approached by a man with a knife. He came out of a van that drove up behind her. This incident occurred at 3:00pm in the afternoon. She fled the scene unharmed and a police report was filed.
- Back in October 2008, Officer Jeff Artman/564 indicated there was an increase in the number of thefts from vehicles in and around Clifton.

A wareness

- Remember that criminal acts occur in all regions of the city and any hour of the day.
- It is highly important to be alert, aware and responsible. Being afraid accomplishes nothing.
- If you see something unusual, communicate the incident to Mulloy Properties and the appropriate authorities.
- If you notice that a security light is out, contact Mulloy Properties.
- Never assume that another resident has reported a problem.
- If you see a tear or a hole in our fence along Bickell, report it to Mulloy Properties.

R esponsibility

- If you must jog or walk alone have protective pepper spray, etc. Carry only your ID with you – no cash.
- Make attempts to jog or walk with another person if possible.
- It is suggested that each unit owner leave his or her front and back porch lights on all night.
- Always lock your unit, even if you plan to just go to the pool or jog for a few minutes.
- Keep your outside shed doors locked.
- Investigate the option of having a security system added to your unit. Contact Mulloy Properties with info.
- Make sure your car doors are always locked. Don't leave items in plain view (packages, CD's, security badges etc.)
- If you leave on vacation or for an extended period of time, please do the following:
 - Let Mulloy Properties and a neighbor know.
 - Have a neighbor keep an eye on your unit if possible.
 - Let Mulloy Properties know if someone is house sitting for you.
 - Make sure your emergency contact information is on file with Mulloy Properties.
 - If you have someone else's car parked in our lot for an extended period, let a neighbor and Mulloy Properties know.
 - Suspicious cars may be towed away at the owner's expense.
